# Our Curriculum

Learning is fun at Catshill First School and Nursery and children enjoy their learning. The children are taught from the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum and the National Curriculum through an exciting topic approach. This enables subjects to be grouped and for maximum engagement and motivation to be incorporated. Each topic cycle is carefully planned to ensure that all curriculum areas are covered and that the children are equipped with the skills, knowledge and understanding needed to fully meet the requirements of the curriculum. Some subjects can be blocked or taught discretely and, due to our partnership with Catshill Middle School, some subjects are taught by specialists.

Learning should be a rewarding and enjoyable experience for everyone and we encourage pupils and teachers to take the learning in a direction that builds on the interests of the child(ren). Each year group produces a curriculum map which gives further details. Parents are informed at the start of each topic of the areas that will be covered.




# **Long Lasting Learning**

Children learn from the experiences that we give them. At Catshill First School and Nursery we have lots of additional space which is used to full effect to support our learners. There is a fully equipped computing suite, a beautiful library and a Forest Schools area. Our wraparound playgrounds, huge field and sensory garden provide ample room for taking the learning outside. Our adjoining Tulip Tree Centre

is yet another area that can be utilised when needed for our pupils and parents.

**Physical Education** is a popular subject at Catshill with all children having the opportunity to work with a sports coach during the week. The Sports Crew, made up of some of our older pupils, support the younger ones at playtime and equipment such as the climbing wall and tyre trail are popular playtime pastimes.



Home Learning can be a way to 'lock in the learning' and we encourage our children to take part in home learning challenges which can be done in all sorts of ways. We welcome family involvement and celebrate all the projects as they arrive. It is hoped that parents/carers will support their child(ren)'s reading development by listening to them read on a regular basis as well as completing other pieces of homework such as phonic work or maths skills.

# **Food and Drinks**

We encourage children to make healthy food and drink choices.

#### <u>Milk</u>

The Nursery and Reception children are provided with a drink of milk and a piece of fruit.

For children in Year One and Two, milk can be purchased at playtime or is available free of charge to pupils entitled to pupil premium funding.



#### Water

In Nursery, children bring their own water bottle in daily. From Reception upwards, all children are provided with a water bottle. Pupils can then access water throughout the day keeping them refreshed and hydrated. Water is also provided at lunchtimes.

#### Fruit and Playtime Snacks



Children in Nursery, Reception, Year One and Year Two are provided with a piece of fruit (or veg) each day as part of the national scheme. The fruit (or veg) choice is varied throughout the year and ranges from pears, apples and bananas to carrots, tomatoes and peas.

In Years Three and Four, children can bring in their own healthy snack to eat at playtime if they wish. We encourage snacks such as fruit, vegetable sticks, yoghurt or cheese sticks for example.

#### School Meals

All children can choose meals from a balanced, varied menu provided to the school by Shire Services. The meals are currently provided free of charge for children Reception, Year One and Year Two and for older pupils who are entitled to claim free school meals. The eligibility criteria is set out below. Pupils who are not entitled to free school meals can purchase meals for £2.30 per day, £11.50 per week (March 2018). Payment must be made on a Monday morning, either by cash or cheque (payable to Shire Services) and should be sent into school in a named, sealed envelope showing your child's name, class and days for which dinner is being paid.



A typical menu is a choice from:

- Roast Chicken Fillet, Stuffing & Gravy
- Natural Oven Baked Fish Fingers
- Pasta Neapolitan (v)
- Seasonal Medley of Vegetables
- Mashed Potatoes, Roast Potatoes
- Baker's Basket
- Chocolate and Mandarin Sundae

If you receive Universal Credit (income not exceeding £7,400 net per year), Income Support, Income Based Jobseekers Allowance, Income related Employment and Support Allowance, Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999, the guarantee element of Pension Credit, Child Tax Credit (but NOT Working Tax Credit) and the Inland Revenue have assessed your income as not in excess of £16,190, you are entitled to claim Free School Meals. Although children in Reception, Year One and Year Two are currently provided with a free lunch, if you are entitled to Free School Meals, it is vital that you still claim these. Further details about free school meal entitlement and menus are available from the school office.

# **Attendance and Punctuality**

Please note that Nursery times vary.

Regular attendance at school is vital if children are to make good progress and to benefit from all the opportunities that school offers. Good attendance and punctuality is important. If your child has been absent from school the law requires you to notify the school of the reason for absence. The Head of School then decides whether the absence is authorised or unauthorised.

As a guide, children should only be absent if they are ill or attending a medical appointment. Leave is granted for days of religious observance or for a significant event such as a wedding or family bereavement. Children should not be kept from school to help at home, because the family has a new pet or to go shopping. We are not allowed to authorise absence for birthdays or personal events. If in doubt, please ask as unauthorised absences are classed as truancy and will be investigated.

Regular attenders are rewarded with certificates, stickers and other prizes.
Children with 100% attendance across the school year receive an attendance award.

### Holidays

Children are expected to be in school for 190 days during the school year. This leaves 175 days for holidays, treats, special events and non-urgent appointments. We are unable to authorise time off for holidays in term time, except in exceptional circumstances. If you need to make an application for leave in term time, a form is available from the office which must be completed.

### **Health Matters**

#### **First Aiders**

At Catshill First School and Nursery, there are several staff who are trained in First Aid and are able to support a child who requires basic treatment. We have a medical room and bathroom management area for pupils with conditions requiring more support.



#### **Medicines**

Generally a sick child should be kept at home. Medicines, such as antibiotics can be given before and after school. Where this is not really possible, or where there is an on going or chronic condition the school is happy to offer help. Medication should be handed in at the office and a medication form completed.



Only medicines prescribed by a doctor that has the dispensing pharmacists label with the child's name and dosage upon it can be given in school. Only a qualified First Aider will administer medicine. We reserve the right to ask parents to come into school to administer the medicine themselves. Children with asthma keep their inhalers in the office. All inhalers must be in date and should be labelled with the child's name.



### **Safety and Welfare**

The safety and welfare of our pupils and their families is of utmost importance to us at Catshill First School and Nursery.

We work in partnership with external agencies to ensure that each child's needs are met and that positive outcomes are achieved. We can provide help and support for a range of needs. Our Children and Family Welfare Support Lead is Pauline Wainman.



#### **Child Protection**

Every school is legally obliged to follow a set procedure if we are concerned about a child's safety or welfare. Head Teachers are required to refer their concerns to the Social Care Department of Social Services for further investigation so that children at risk can be quickly identified.

We have a duty of care to protect and safeguard the children at our school. We follow the Worcestershire Safeguarding Procedures. All adults in school are subject to Enhanced CRB checks whether they are employees or volunteers. The school's designated teacher for child protection is Mr Essenhigh. He is supported by Mrs Plant and Mrs Wainman. The school does not investigate the concerns or make decisions about whether or not a child is being abused.

We work in partnership with all agencies to ensure that children are safe and can provide help and support if you are struggling in any way. If your child has a named Social Worker please let us know.
