Unlocking the learning

Unlocking the learning at home – Enjoy the fun! How many new things can you find out about pirates that you did not know? Is your knowledge from stories read or real life facts.

Get reading – We cannot emphasise enough how important reading is as it supports writing skills and understanding of words. It is an important life skill that enables your child to access all areas of the curriculum. Please read regularly with your child at home to support their learning and this will help them when we do our reading SATs.

Get exploring – What can you find out about Pirates? Were there any female pirates? Who was the most feared pirate? Use the local library to learn more. Is there a famous pirate that came from Bromsgrove?

Get creating – complete one of the home learning heroes to help enrich your understanding of the topic. We have had some amazing home learning projects coming in and it is great to see children sharing their learning at home.

Please ensure:

Your child has their PE kit in school – it is very important for children to take part in PE for 2 hours every week. If they do not have their PE kit then your child will receive a letter home asking you to provide them with suitable clothing.

Maths. We will be covering...

We will continue to work on the four rules. Addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. Children will be developing their mental maths so that they can solve these operations accurately and quickly. Please support your child to learn the x2, x5 and x10 tables.

Children will be continuing to develop their knowledge and understanding of fractions and linking this to doubling and halving including problem solving.

Linked to our topic we will learn about position and direction. Children will create and work with treasure maps to locate pirate treasure using co-ordinates.

We will be using measures where we will look at length, weight and capacity and what items use this unit of measurement. We will also problem solve using measures.

Try to look at maths in the environment to support. We will send home information and homework to support children developing their maths skills further.

Land Ahoy!

Topic. We will be covering...

In Year Two the children will be focusing on the topic 'Land Ahoy.'

Science will look at different images of boats and identifying what materials they are made from. We will also revisit properties of materials and investigate which materials float or sink. We will explore whether the shape of a material matters in terms of if it will float or sink.

History will involve using stories about famous pirates and explorers and looking at different aspects of their life. Children will access a range of materials to find out information about the pirate code and make fact files about 'A Pirate's Life.'

Geography is all about different countries and where they are located on a map. We shall also explore what different symbols mean on a map.

Art and Design will be designing flags using a range of shapes, colours and patterns.

DT We will create pirate hats, telescopes and any other useful pirate equipment.

Computing will continue to involve important learning about keeping safe online. This will also include learning about algorithms and how we can use these to create shapes and patterns using the Bee Bots.

Music involves learning shanty songs sung by pirates and develop performance skills. We will use a range of instruments to achieve this.

RE continues to look at how we celebrate special days and events. We shall also study Jewish people.

PE will continue to develop skills further through dance and look at how we can move our bodies to create a sequence.

PSHE is an important part of our curriculum where we will look at relationships, families and growing up.

English. We will be covering...

English is full of exciting opportunities this term. We will be exploring descriptions about pirates and writing pirate poems. There will be a continued focus upon what a complete sentence looks like and how we can improve them by adding adjectives, conjunctions and expanded nouns. We shall be using some quality texts to support our writing such as, The Pirates Next Door by Jonny Duddle, The Pirate Cruncher by Jonny Duddle and The Troll by Julia Donaldson. As part of our English learning we shall focus on the correct use of full-stops, apostrophes for contraction and singular possession and question marks. Spelling is going to be a high priority this term where children will be encouraged to use their knowledge of phonics to apply to their written work. It will be useful to practise spellings at home with your child. High frequency words have been given at the last parents evening. We have a big focus on handwriting presentation including letter formation. We feel that by presenting work neatly that this shows pride in what we do. Please read pirate books at home too.

Pirate day will be on Monday 24th February. Please dress up as a pirate for the start of our topic as we will be experiencing what it is like to be a pirate. (Please do not buy new costumes, use what you have at home.)
