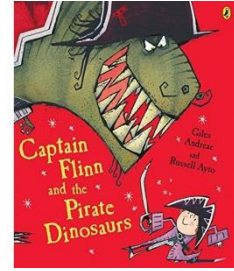

Comprehension

- Can you retell part of the story to a family member?
Who are the characters? Where is the story set? What happens? How does it end?

Onomatopoeia

Onomatopoeia is a word which sounds like what it means.

'Thud', 'crash', 'bang' and 'buzz' are all examples.

- Can you find any examples of onomatopoeia in the story? Can you write a list of words?

Simile

A simile describes something by comparing it to something else, using *like* or *as*.



For example: As brave as a lion.

- Can you find any similes in the story? Can you think of your own?
- Find words that the author has used instead of 'said', e.g. sobbed, cried, stammered.
- Make a list of the different ways that the author has described the pirate dinosaurs. How would you describe them?
