As we begin the new four-week national lockdown, I am writing to confirm that Catshill First School and Nursery will continue to remain open for our pupils.


We believe that this lockdown will, if anything, make school even safer because it will reduce the contact our children and staff would have had with adults who would previously have been going out to work, travelling or socialising.

There will be no major changes to the measures that the school has put in place (although we will continue to make small adjustments as appropriate).

Although our children are in a bubble at school, we do ask that you are mindful that play dates, sleepovers and parties are not permitted within the lockdown rules. The impact of the national lockdown and our in-school measures will be undermined if pupils are allowed to socialise during the evenings or at weekends. We are asking for parents to help us with this. None of us want the sacrifices that we are making for the greater good to be pointless.

Similarly, please do not send your child into school if they are unwell, and particularly if they have Covid symptoms. We are doing everything we can to keep the school safe and we need parents to help us with this also.

As always, I want to finish by thanking you for your support, kindness and patience. Your smiles, words and messages of support and thanks mean a lot to the staff of our school.





CHILDREN IN NEED 2020



The closing date is 14 December and we need to encourage anyone living and/or working in Catshill to have their say so we can ensure this is community led. Please follow these links to the surveys.


