Understanding the World

We will be exploring different types of animals each week:pets, safari, sea life and farm. We will be finding out facts about animals and make comparisons between them.
We will learn about how and why <u>Christians</u> <u>celebrate Easter</u> and how new life begins in Springtime.

Expressive Arts and Design

Over this half term we will be using a range of techniques to create pictures of animals. We will look closely at the different colours and patterns we can see on the animals and how we can recreate them using paint, crayons, pastels and collage. We will role play being vets to care for pets and wild animals and retell our stories using a variety of props and masks.

Literacy

We will share a range of stories and non-fiction books about animals and use them to find out what they need and how to look after pets. This topic is a great opportunity for children to give meaning to their marks and develop their pencil grip and control. We will continue our 'Write Dance' work to develop our large muscles for writing.

Independence in Nursery

The children in Nursery are working so hard to develop their independence skills and we are so proud of them. The skills we will be working on are; -putting our coats on (and pulling the sleeves the correct way) -doing our zips up - putting shoes and socks on and off -putting our gloves on. It would be fantastic if you can support this at home.

Choose one or two animals per week to find out

about and create a book/fact file. Draw or print out an animal for each page and have a go at writing

about them. Grown-ups can help by adding notes to

what your child has said about their writing.

Weather

Please keep an eye on the weather forecast as it can change from one day to the next at this time of year. It is essential your children come to Nursery ready to play and learn both inside and out. This can include hats, gloves, scarves and warm waterproof coats. Please ensure all items of clothing are named.

Fun in the Forest

These sessions will continue this half term. The children will be building shelters for animals who live in the forest and using the different textures as part of our art work.
For children staying at home you could explore your garden or local woods. Have a look and listen for birds and animals or try making a bird feeder with pipe cleaners/string and cheerios.

Home Learning

Paint, draw or collage on to paper plates to create animal masks. What will you turn in to?

Can you move like an animal? Will you slither like a snake, stomp like an elephant or leap like a leopard? Have a look at <u>Barefoot books</u> who have some lovely animal songs to move to and sing along with!!
