Andy Seed Book Signing

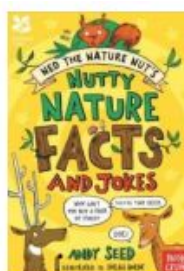
Dear Parents and Carers

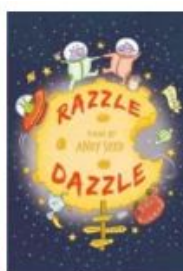
As part of the project, every child will receive a free copy of this book which shows them as real authors and inspired writers.

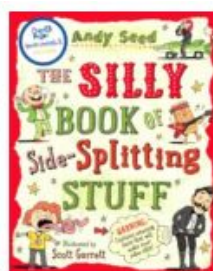
For those children in Hangout Club that day, please send money in a named envelope to the office on the day.



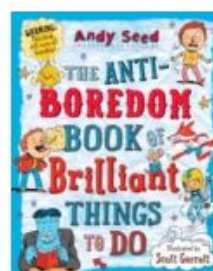

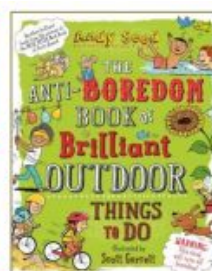
