Sleepovers, Meet-ups, Playdates and Bubble Mixing Please be aware that there are children and families within our community who are currently positive with coronavirus.

Unfortunately, it has come to our attention that some families are continuing to ignore the lockdown restrictions. We have had reports of parents who are still allowing their children to visit or stay in other people's houses. There are children who are having sleepovers, going to parties and mixing in several different bubbles. We have had reports of and have seen children mixing with others in the community.

If the child is then coming into school, they are putting lots of other families and our school staff at risk.

If the child is not coming into school, they will still be putting your family at risk.

We know that allowances are in place for childcare/support and this message is aimed at those who are not complying with the rules that are in place to reduce the spread of coronavirus.

If you know that someone is breaking the rules, please use the non-emergency police line on 101 to keep our community safe and reduce the risk of us becoming ill from this awful virus.

Staff Lateral Flow Testing

We might not be able to get together with loved ones at the moment, but you can make plans with friends and family to take part in the world's largest wildlife survey, all from the comfort of your own homes.





Remote Learning Update

From Year 1 upwards, the learning for each child will now be able to be found in the child's epraise planner. Following feedback, we have made this change to support families with more than one child and those who were having problems with accessing the links on their device. We hope that this will make things a little easier. One parent has already described this as a 'game changer'.

<u>Data</u>

Do you need more data? If you are running low due to needing to be online more often, we have a number of sim cards with data available. These sims cards are free and will give you an extra 30GB of data. Please ring school to arrange to collect one.

Chromebooks

We have now allocated all of the chromebooks given to us by the Government. However, if access to technology is stopping your child from doing their learning, please let your child's class teacher know and we will do what we can.

Printing

We have tried to make sure that our online learning does not rely on you having a printer. If you need the work printing out and are able to collect it, send your child's class teacher a message via epraise and we will print off a pack for you.

Parents Evening

As you would expect things have to be done very differently due to the pandemic. Consequently, our parent consultation evenings on 3rd (5 pm-7 pm) & 4th (3.30 pm-5.30 pm) February 2021 will be via video link using a platform called School Cloud. Attached is the parent information sheet for booking appointments which we have successfully piloted with some families.

You are invited to book an appointment for your child(ren) for either of the evenings. Appointments will run on any device with the internet. Appointments are for 7 minutes and you will be able to see the time count down at the top of your screen. A useful video link is also attached for you to assist with this process. Please log on to the system 5 minutes before your appointment.



Reopening of Schools

We do not have any information on when schools will be reopening. We know that schools across the country will be closed until at least February half term. However, there is speculation that schools could be closed until Easter. The government has said reopening of schools would be prioritised when the current coronavirus lockdown restrictions are eased. England's deputy chief medical officer Jenny Harries also said schools may open region by region in a phased return after the February half term. Education Secretary, Gavin Williamson has said that schools and parents will get 2 weeks' notice to get ready for any new arrangements. We will, of course, update you with any further information as soon as we are able to.

Google Meet Sessions

Part of our daily learning provision is for children to have the opportunity to join our online class meetings. We have been delighted to see so many children joining us each day. We know that some siblings can't come to every session due



to time clashes but hope that parents are able to help them to take turns and to attend when they can. The children enjoy seeing their teacher and their friends, they gain understanding of the tasks set and are loving the story time sessions too. One of our teachers even dressed as an Egyptian mummy for a session yesterday!

<u>Guidelines for a successful Google Meet</u>

- Our platform is encrypted so only those who have our invitation link are able to join. These are sent out to parents via epraise. Teachers will not let 'unknown' account names join so please make sure your name or the child's name is clear.
 - Choose a location, if possible, where your child is not going to be distracted and where people aren't continually going past
- If you join the meeting a minute or so before the start, you will then be in a 'waiting room' and the teacher will be able to admit you when the meeting starts
- Make sure your child starts the session with the microphone muted. The home computers often pick up background noises and conversations from others
 - You do not have to have the camera on. Some children prefer not to show their face
 - Please make sure that your child is wearing appropriate clothes!
- We record each session and store on a secure platform this is for safeguarding purposes. We don't share or publish these recordings

I know we have had a few technical hitches while we all get used to teaching in this way. If this is still happening, please do get in touch with us and we will do what we can to solve the issues.
