★Strike Arrangements ★

SCHOOL CLOSED WEDNESDAY 1ST FEBRUARY

This is the update regarding the planned forthcoming teacher strikes of the National Education Union (NEU) across the country and regionally.

The dates that will be affected are: Wednesday 1st February 2023 Wednesday 1st March 2023 Wednesday 15th March 2023 **Thursday 16th March 2023**

On these days striking teachers will not be available to teach lessons, take registrations or supervise during breaks. Additionally, teachers in other unions are not allowed to cover for striking staff in any way by taking their classes, doubling up and making larger groups or any other actions that are deemed to be undermining the planned industrial action of NEU members.

As I intimated in my communication last week the NEU union represents the large majority of teachers in both schools. Having assessed the potential impact of teachers from Catshill not attending for work, and ensuring that all health & safety implications are managed across the schools the depleted staff teams are unable to safely function. Both schools are consequently closed.

We will be contacting the parents/carers of all Children Looked After (CLA), those on Child Protection Plans (CP), Child in Need Plans (CIN), and those with Education Health & Care Plans (EHCPs) and offering them access to school on these days if they wish it.

At Catshill Middle school pupils will be able to access Century Tech from home and can use their bespoke pathway in the subjects of English, Maths & Science. Catshill First School pupils will have access to a set of activities for the strike days.

The decision to close a school is never taken lightly, but in this instance, where staff have taken lawful industrial action, we have no choice but to take appropriate steps to ensure the health and well-being of our pupils. Attendance records will not be affected by these closures.

There will be a number of parents who have been invoiced for additional nursery provision that will now not be provided as a result of the strike action. Please be assured that these sessions will be credited against the Spring 2 half-term invoices.

Free School Meal families have been contacted with a google form to book a lunch to collect from the school if you wish. At the Middle school, there will be no morning tuck option for those who attend. I would like to apologise to parents/carers for the obvious inconvenience that this will cause you but hope that you will understand that these strike days are set nationally/regionally and are beyond my control. Should the picture change between planned strike days I will contact you to adapt plans if this becomes an



This week we have been exploring capacity, using rainbow counters and alien slime. We have some superstar readers in Reception too!








Reminders and Dates for your Diaries 🖈

- SATs Workshop for Parents Year 2 A letter has been epraised out, inviting you to attend a SATs workshop on Friday 3rd February 9.00am to 10.00am. Please follow this link if you would like to attend, and we will confirm your place shortly.
- Vision Tests for Reception Worcestershire Specialist Children's Service offers a routine vision test to every child in Reception year. The Orthoptist will be attending Catshill First School and Nursery on Thursday 9th February to test their vision. A form has been sent home with your child before Christmas for you to complete and return, but only if you DO NOT want your child to have a vision test.
- Medication A polite reminder to parents that medication can only be given to the children if it is prescribed by the Doctor and is required to be given 4 times a day, as per the school policy, and a medication form completed, which can be collected from the administration office.
- Parking Just a gentle reminder regarding parking when dropping off and picking up children - can parents please be mindful not to park on the pavement opposite the school, as buggies and pushchairs cannot get past on the pavement, and are having to step into the busy road. Please be advised that the neighbourhood policing team will be patrolling regularly.
