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Year 1 Animals and their Habitats

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Unlocking the Learning

Our new topic 'Animals and their Habitats' will allow the children to learn about the animals that live in our local and wider community. They will be exploring animals and their habitats from the seven continents of the world. Here are some 'Creative Homework Projects' that we would like the children to complete over the coming weeks. These will allow the children to extend their understanding of the topic, demonstrate their creative talents and share their learning with the rest of the class.

Your child should choose at least one task. Your child is likely to require support from you to complete the tasks and we hope that you enjoy working on them together. Photographs of all work produced will be displayed in the classroom, entrance halls or display boards around school. We will also be sharing some projects in assembly.

As scientists we will be identifying whether an animal is a carnivore, herbivore or omnivore and labelling basic parts of the human body including those related to the senses. We will be exploring the environment at Forest School and finding natural objects that animals in the wild will use to build their habitats.

In Geography we will be using our prior knowledge of animals through a study of the seven continents, and the North and South polar regions. We will look at pandas, penguins, sharks and elephants, as well as lesser-known birds, such as the swallows.

Using our computing skills we will develop our understanding of technology and how it can help us. We will start to become familiar with the different components of a computer by developing our keyboard skills. We will also consider how to use technology responsibly.

As designers we will be designing, making and evaluating animal puppets. We will be exploring the use of appropriate techniques and with help measure, mark out, cut and shape a range of materials. We will practice using tools eg scissors and a hole punch safely. We will assemble, join and combine materials and components together using a variety of temporary methods.

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As mathematicians we will be learning place value within 50. We will explore 1 more and 1 less and use number lines to estimate. We will be comparing and measuring lengths and heights using objects and centimetres. We will also be learning how to measure and compare mass and capacity and heavier and lighter objects.

As writers we will be exploring traditional tales. We will focus on structuring sentences, using adjectives to describe characters and settings and using the conjunctions and, but and because to join two sentences together.

Important information
