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# **Spring 1 2024**

### **Personal, Social and Emotional Development**

This half term we welcome 11 new children into our fantastic new setting! Our current children will be settling into the new space as well as helping to support the transition of our January starters. ### **Mathematics**

We will be continuing to count, recognise and represent numbers to 5 and will subitise to 5. We will do lots of work on 2D shapes and will begin to develop mathematical language to describe and name these shapes. We will also learn to identify simple ABAB patterns and create our own.

# **Physical Development**

In PE this half term we will continue to gain confidence in taking our own shoes and socks off. We will learn how to move safely with control- going over, under and through apparatus and climb above our own height. We will begin to develop core strength through a programme called 'write dance'.

# **Communication and Language**

We will continue to build our vocabulary through Story Dough sessions where we come up with our own exciting characters.

We will continue to explore the concept of 'who' and introduce the concept of 'where' during Nursery Narrative sessions.

# **Understanding the World**

This half term we will begin to learn about why we are all unique and the importance we have in our families. We will learn about the responsibility we have in our community. We will look at simple maps to map our journey from home to school and the things we see on the way.

# **Expressive Arts and Design**

We will continue to mark make in our own expressive ways, learning how to create closed shapes with continuous lines and how we can use these shapes to represent objects.

# Literacy

Whilst exploring our topic books and ones related, we will continue to build a bank of new vocabulary and discuss both the text and illustrations. Our new outdoor area has a reading shed that we cannot wait to share stories in!
