As part of our home learning, we would like the children to take part in one or more of our creative homework projects that link to this half term's learning. Our topic for this half term is Local History, a History based topic looking at local buildings and which ones should be preserved and why.

We would ask that this project reflects seven weeks' worth of work, and demonstrates the children's own work, although we really appreciate your support in helping them complete their homework.

As readers, we will be reading Bloom by Nicola Skinner and The Last Tree by Emily Haworth-Booth. These are thought provoking texts about our World and how we need to preserve the plants that live on it.

As historians we will be studying Local History. In this unit, the children will investigate their local area, and consider which buildings are of significance and should be preserved.

Using our computing skills we will be looking at Branching Databases. How are they used and how we can make one ourselves. We will be interrogating given branching databases and those we make ourselves.

In P.E. we will be developing our striking and fielding skills. We will learning accurate throwing and confident catching. As well as how to strike a ball. We will also be working on the skills of teamwork - a vital part of any game.

As writers, we will be considering the messages our texts give us and how we can work to support our World and the plants living on it. We will also look at how we are all responsible for playing our part in supporting conservation.

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As individual readers, we will focus on developing fluency and intonation through reading with an adult using modelling and paired reading.

As scientists, we will be developing our knowledge of plants. We will be finding out what the parts of a plant do and how we rely on plants for our everyday life, food and oxygen.
