Living in the shadow of a volcano Research what it is like living in the shadow of an active volcano. What do they do to keep themselves safe? You can present this however you would like.	Maps Map out the different volcanoes you can find on Earth. Can you find facts about them to present to the class?
Anatomy of a volcano Create a drawing and annotate it showing the anatomy of a style of volcano.	Major Eruptions Can you research a major eruption and what happened?When did it take place?	Volcano Could you make a model of a volcano? These could be working models which we could then erupt together in school.
Living then Can you write a diary imagining you are alive during a volcanic eruption? How would you feel and what would you see?	Abstract Artists Can you research the art of some historical and modern day abstract artists? You could research Mondrian, Picasso, Kooning, Pollock, Kandinsky or Steven Brown.	Art Can you produce some art in an Abstract style?

As scientists, we will be studying our nutrition and diet. We will examine the difference between herbivores, carnivores and omnivores. We will also be looking at the effects of food waste.

As geographers we will be studying why people live near volcanoes. We will learn about how a volcano is formed and about volcano classification. As well as what are earthquakes and where do we get them.

Using our computing skills, we will be using the skills of stop animation. This will allow us to make simple films.

In PE, we will be working on our gymnastics skills. Learning to perform a variety of floor and vault movements.

As writers, we will be studying the texts Lord of the Forest and the Gorilla. Two wonderful books about animals which generate some amazing writing.
